

Power



Types of Power

Active Power: A power that can rule.

Passive Power: A power that decides.



What are the main powers in our government?

1. Executive (President)

Functions as the CEO facilitating the will of the other powers while also providing guidance. Wields the union's power to represent the country to the world.

2. State (Senate)

Represents the state. Main check on federal power.

Treaty making, advise and consent, political appointment.

3. People (House)


Represents the people. Check on both Federal and State power.

Writes the laws, power of the purse and war powers. Accountability equals adaptability.

4. Judiciary (Supreme Court) (Passive power) Oversight between the three active powers.


